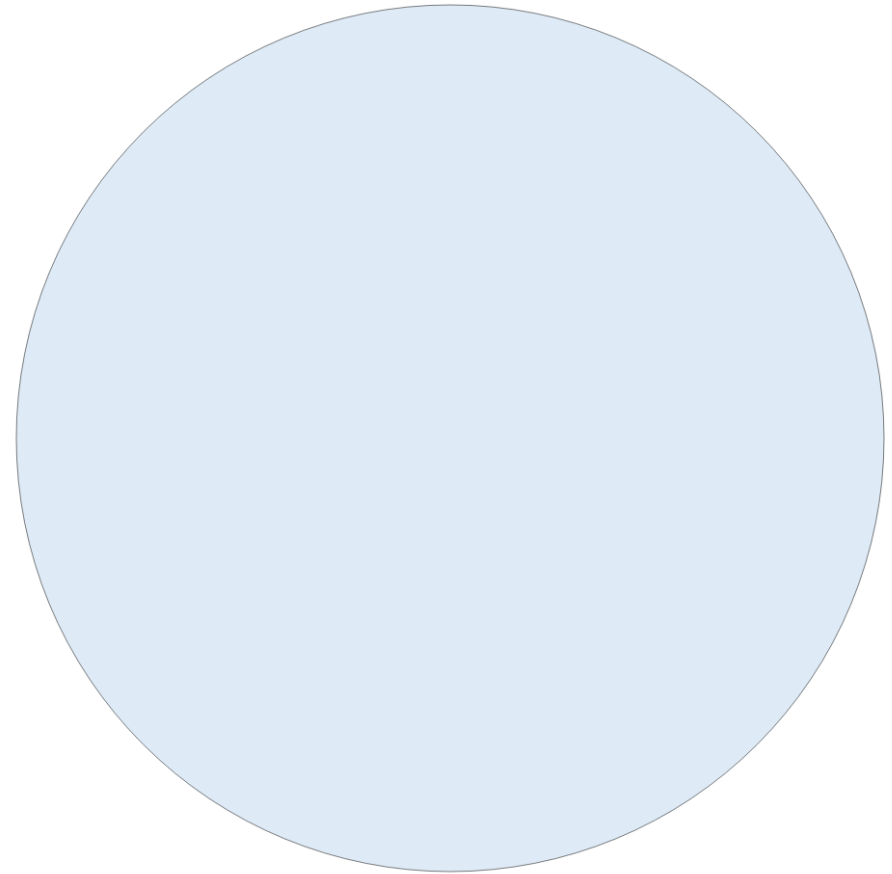

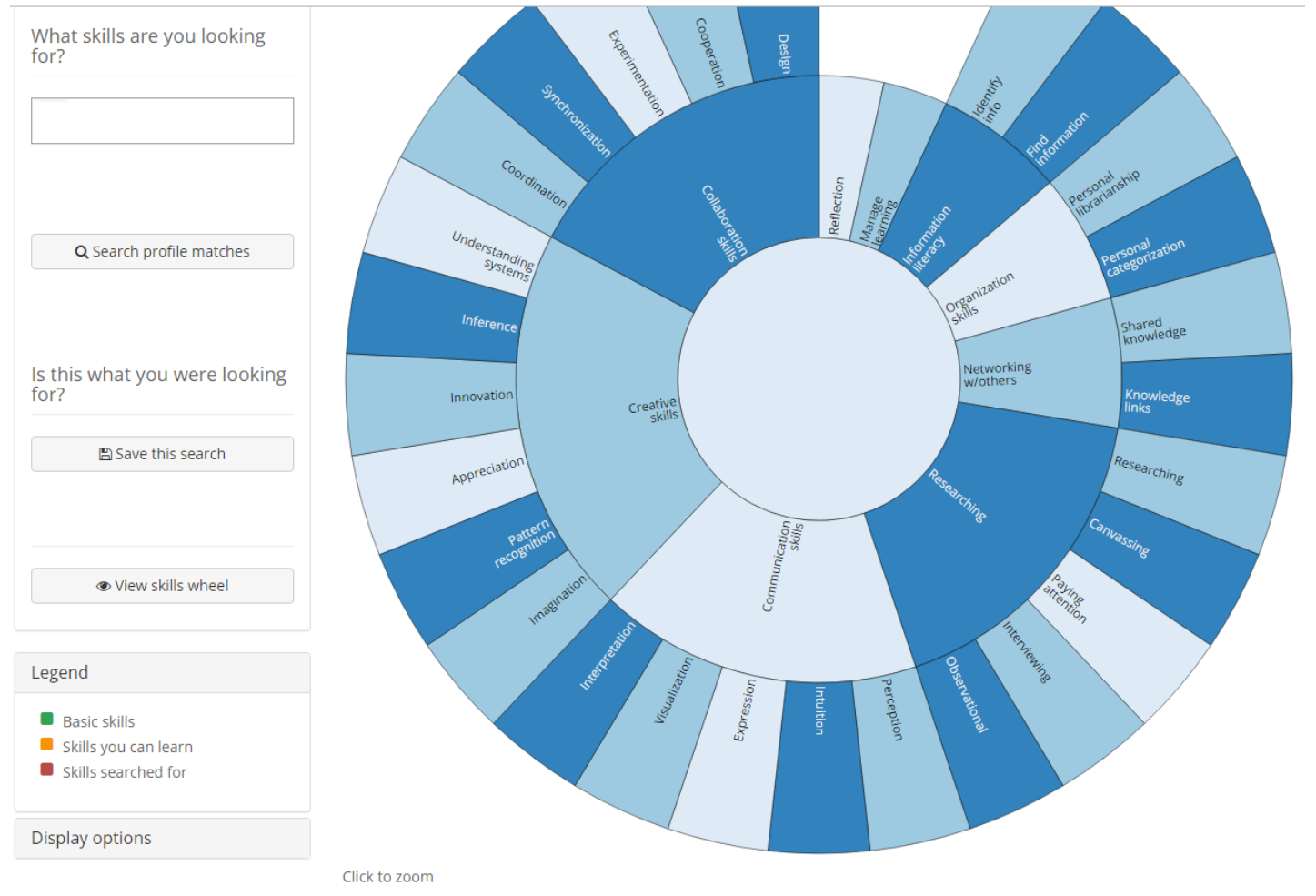

Open Badges

Is a digital indicator of an achievement or a skill learned online or offline. It is an image file (PNG) which contains metadata (json) about: the date of the issue (and the expiration date), the issuer and the earner, the evidence verifying the credential

A badge is a visual representation of the skill acquired. The first and second level skill are never going to be acquired by the users so we should not assign badges to these first two levels since they are really classifications of the skills



Open Badge

How we can assign a badge to a skill



We can distinguish three important things:

- Description of the skill
- Criteria to achieve the badge should also be as explicit as possible
- Design the logo
